***1. Scope of Work***

The scope of work for this Amendment No. 1 to the Financial Assistance Award (Award) is the planning, design and construction of rural primary care facilities.

This Award continues funding for the Denali Commission “Small Clinic” program. A total of \$9,070,487.12 is identified in the attached “Table C – Project and Project Management Funding”.

Table C provides for the following:

Construction funding for clinic projects in Ambler, Grayling, Newtok, Noatak, and Shungnak. ANTHC will await instructions from the Commission before entering into sub-award agreements on these projects. All of these projects have some outstanding pre-award conditions to resolve.

Construction funding for a new Tanacross clinic is provided. The Commission wants ANTHC to explore a sub-award agreement similar to the Yukon-Kuskokwim Health Corporation for the Village of Tanacross. The Commission desires a test case to determine if this management model works on the village level.

Corrections to the Commission approved project funding and corresponding ANTHC management expenses for the Sleetmute and Tetlin projects. The financial assistance award was incorrect for these two projects.

Funding is provided for moving projects that have successfully completed conceptual planning into design development. The mechanism for this will be through the technical assistance subcommittee of the Commission Health Steering Committee. The technical assistance subcommittee will verify when an organization has successfully completed a clinic business plan and ANTHC will verify that the community has reasonably identified a clinic site for development. At this point, the design funding can be provided to the specific project on a first come, first serve basis until the dedicated funds for this purpose are exhausted.

Funding for conceptual planning for 23 communities is provided. It is understood by the parties that the mechanism for transferring these funds to the interested parties carrying out the planning work has not been fully developed. However, the parties understand that ANTHC may bear some minimal direct costs associated with conceptual planning projects to verify site development and utility extension concerns (e.g. travel, soil

testholes, surveying, etc.). At a minimum, by providing the funding to ANTHC through this Amendment No. 1 these site development questions can be addressed. The 23 communities are listed below.

Lastly, funding is provided to expand the prototype clinic design suggested furnishings list. The Commission wants the prototype clinic design to include a suggested fixture, furnishings and equipment list. A scope of work shall be jointly developed by ANTHC, the Indian Health Service and the Commission for this effort.

**2. *Other Award Conditions***

There are no other changes to the Financial Assistance Award dated April 2002 for Project No. 0071-DC-2002-I24.
