Dear Mr. Anderson:

The City of Bethel's grant application to the Denali Commission for funding to purchase a System Ten-Sixty Baler, parts, and baling wire was approved. Please find the City of Bethel's order included in this facsimile transmission for a System Ten-Sixty Baler with 48-inch wide conveyor and red and green control lights. The City will honor Purchase Order #351016 in the amount of \$66,347.50 and pay you upon receipt of the baler, spare parts, and baling wire to town and your submission of an invoice. This is the amount approved in the grant for the baler items listed below.

As we discussed on the telephone, you will most likely ship the baler by barge from the Seattle Dock to the City's dock in Bethel, Alaska. The City will be responsible for transporting the baler from the dock to the Recycling Center where it will be housed. There are three barge companies serving Bethel during the summer months (June 1 – October 1). Each one has its own departure and arrival schedule and pricing methods.
