

A. INTRODUCTION

Throughout this Amendment these entities are referred to as follows:

Native Village of Port Lions	=	Village
Kodiak Area Native Association	=	KANA
Alaska Native Tribal Health Consortium	=	ANTHC
Cooperative Project Agreement	=	CPA
Denali Commission	=	Commission

On Aug. 12, 2004, ANTHC and the Native Village of Port Lions executed a CPA authorized by the Denali Commission to complete the design studies and construction planning for a new health clinic in the Native Village of Port Lions, Alaska, and the site development of future multi-use facilities. No construction will be performed under this project phase. The project was funded by Denali Commission Financial Assistance Award Project No. 0071-DC-2002-I24, Addendum E, dated June 2004.

On July 21, 2005, ANTHC and the Native Village of Port Lions executed an Amendment No. 1 to the CPA to add \$12,500 provided by the Kodiak Area Native Association. The additional funds expanded the scope of work for the future multi-use facilities to include space programming and a reexamination of site suitability.

B. REVISION OF BUDGET AND SCOPE OF WORK

This Amendment adds \$10,000 via Denali Commission Financial Assistance Award Project No. 185-05, Amendment No. 2, dated September 2005; the funds will pay for changing the clinic's existing design to include an ambulance bay.

This Amendment also adds \$4,000 provided by the Kodiak Area Native Association; the funds will pay for changing the clinic's existing design to include a laboratory.

Project funding therefore totals \$146,500.

A revised Project Budget and Funding Sources Table is provided below.

Based upon proposed Federal funding for this project, an environmental review in accordance with the National Environmental Policy Act (NEPA) and the National Historic Preservation Act (NHPA) is required. The Alaska Native Tribal Health Consortium (ANTHC) has considered all potential environmental concerns (specific and cumulative effects) associated with the project in consultation with applicable federal, state, and local authorities. An environmental review was completed in July 2004 with respect to the proposed sanitation facilities construction at Port Lions, Alaska under Project No. AN 04-GA3. This Amendment will not change the scope outlined in the original document, and therefore no additional environmental review is necessary at this time.

If the scope of work is changed in the future, then the ANTHC will revisit this environmental review to determine if potential environmental concerns have been addressed.
