A. INTRODUCTION

Throughout this Amendment these entities are referred to as follows:

Alaska Native Tribal Health Consortium	=	ANTHC
Financial Assistance Sub-Award	=	FSA

On September 19, 2003, the ANTHC and the Yukon-Kuskokwim Health Corporation executed an FSA authorized by the Denali Commission to construct a new health clinic in the City of Toksook Bay, Alaska. The project was funded by the Denali Commission.

B. AMENDMENT TO REVISE PROJECT BUDGET AND FUNDING SOURCES TABLE

This project was originally awarded \$1,000,000 to fund the design of the clinic and construction of the clinic foundation. This Amendment adds \$1,720,100 of funding to construct the remainder of the building, including exterior and interior walls, roof, mechanical and electrical systems, and clinic interior. The additional funds are derived from Denali Commission Financial Assistance Award Project No. 0100-DC-2003-I13, dated July 2003.

The total award therefore equals \$2,720,100.

A revised Project Budget and Funding Sources Table is provided below.

The ANTHC is being separately funded by the Denali Commission in the amount of \$5,500 for program and professional operations expenses associated with the scope of work of this Amendment. These expenses include ANTHC professional salaries, travel, and related professional support. ANTHC was previously funded by the Commission in the amount of \$28,000 for program and professional operations expenses associated with the scope of work of the original project.

When totaled, the amounts equal \$33,500, which is the maximum program and professional operations expense permitted by the Memorandum of Understanding Between the Denali Commission and the Alaska Native Tribal Health Consortium for Alaska Rural Primary Care Facilities and Sanitation Facilities Planning, Design, and Construction, dated July 2002. The \$33,500 is approximately 1.2% of the \$2,720,100 total project cost.

This Agreement shall take effect upon signature by all parties and remain in effect until the expiration of the "Performance Period" specified within the Commission's Financial Assistance Award.

This document constitutes Amendment No. 1 to the FSA for the new health clinic in the City of Toksook Bay, Alaska. All other sections of the original FSA remain in effect as agreed upon and executed.



TO: FOR THE RECORD

Based upon proposed Federal funding for this project, an environmental review in accordance with the National Environmental Policy Act (NEPA) and the National Historic Preservation Act (NHPA) is required. The Alaska Native Tribal Health Consortium (ANTHC) has considered all potential environmental concerns (specific and cumulative effects) associated with the project in consultation with applicable federal, state, and local authorities. An environmental review was completed in September 2003 with respect to the proposed sanitation facilities construction at Toksook Bay, Alaska under Project No. AN 02-G51. This Amendment will not change the scope outlined in the original document, and therefore no additional environmental review is necessary at this time.

If the scope of work is changed in the future, then the ANTHC will revisit this environmental review to determine if potential environmental concerns have been addressed.
