1. Scope of Work

The Commission is providing a total of \$8,060,818 to the Alaska Housing Finance Corporation (AHFC) for construction projects and tasks as identified in Tables A and B. All of these projects were approved for funding through Resolution 05-15 at the April 2005 Commission meeting, however two are still conducting design work and are not authorized to proceed at this time.

The AHFC will be responsible for notifying the Commission when projects listed below have completed all due diligence activities and are ready to be funded for construction. Table A includes funding for construction projects that are authorized to proceed, \$100,000 for a comprehensive statewide elder supportive housing strategy and \$100,000 for management fees. Table B includes funding for the establishment of a construction pool to fund the two projects awaiting final cost estimates.

Any funding changes in projects listed under Table A shall be reallocated to the construction pool in Table B. Award status for all projects shall be considered in November 2005.

Neither of the projects is construction ready, therefore a pool in the amount of \$4,566,680 has been established to fund these projects in the final cost estimates. Funding for these projects is pending program manager approval.

3. Award Performance Period

The Award performance period is September 1, 2005 through September 1, 2007. This is the period during which Award recipients can incur obligations or costs against this Award.

A portion of funds for this award are provided by the Health Resources and Services Agency (HRSA). HRSA requires that all recipients expend funds in a timely manner. In keeping with that requirement, funds associated with this award must be expended in full per the award performance period listed above.

4. Direct and Indirect Costs

The cost principles of OMB Circular A-122 are applicable to this Award. Management fees for this project are identified in Table A. Please refer to the cost principles regulations for specific details on other allowable charges under this Award. The parties

acknowledge that AHFC is eligible for management fees as identified in the attached Table A.

5. Budget and Program Revisions

Administrative Circular A-110 applies to this Award. Please refer to the Administrative Circular for specific details on revisions to this Award. Administrative Circular require that AHFC will inform the Commission in writing (e-mail, letter, or report) at the earliest possible date of any unanticipated project cost overrun, project schedule delays, or changes in the project scope or changed site conditions.

With each sub-award, AHFC shall document a project cash flow timeline for both Commission and contributor funding. In general, the Commission supports utilizing all of the Commission funding up front if the applicants contributions are loans. However, if the applicant's contributions are from grants or their own cash reserves the cash flow shall be equitably distributed between the various funding sources. Each cash flow timeline shall be based upon the milestones as reported in the quarterly reports and updated as appropriate to reflect project timeline and funding changes.

6. Payments

Payments under this Award will be made through the U.S. Department of Treasury's Automated Standard Application for Payment (ASAP) system. The ASAP system is the Commission's mechanism for requesting and delivering Federal funds to Award recipients. AHFC must be registered with the ASAP program in order to make draw downs. Payments shall be made in accordance with Administrative Circular A-110.

7. Reporting

If there are technical limitations which may prevent the recipient from meeting this requirement, please contact the Program Manager listed in this Award.

- a. **Progress Reports** shall be submitted on a quarterly basis. The first reporting period is July 1, 2005 to September 30, 2005, and each quarter thereafter. Reports are due within 30 days of the end of the reporting period. Progress reports shall include the following:
 - i. Total project funding, including both Denali Commission funding and other project funding sources.
 - ii. The total project expenditures for the project as of the end of the reporting period, including both Denali Commission and other funding sources.

- iii. Update schedule and milestone information as identified in the Scope of Work
 - iv. Narrative summary of the project status and accomplishments to date, and address the following questions: is the project on schedule, is the project on budget, and what actions are planned to address any project problems.
 - v. **Construction Projects:** Photographic documentation of project progress shall be provided with the progress reports for active construction projects. The photo documentation shall include a minimum of three dated photos per reporting period such that a complete record of the construction is maintained over time, from “before,” showing the situation before the start of construction, to “during” showing work proceeding on the project, and “after” to show the finished project. Photos shall be provided in a digital format as part of the on-line report. A short description of the activity and names of those in the photos shall also be provided.
 - vi. **Non-Construction Projects:** For minor repair and renovation projects or other non-construction projects, pictures should be provided of before and after, or photos that are representative of the funded activity, to the extent possible. Photos shall be provided in a digital format as part of the on-line report. A short description of the activity and names of those in the photos shall also be provided.
- b. **Wage and Residency Reports** (Construction Projects only) shall be submitted on an annual basis using the Denali Commission On-line Project Database. The reporting period is January 1st – December 31st of each year. Reports are due within 30 days of the end of the reporting period. The Wage and Residency Report shall include the following information by for each construction project
- i. Total number of Local Residents employed during the year and their total payroll earnings.
 - ii. Total number of Non-Local Alaska Residents employed during the year and their total payroll earnings.
 - iii. Total number of Non-Alaska Residents employed during the year and their total payroll earnings.
- c. **Federal Single Audits** shall be submitted annually, when required. In accordance with OMB Circular A-133, which requires [subpart 200] “Non-Federal entities that expend \$500,000 or more in a year in Federal Awards shall have a single or program-specific audit conducted for that year in accordance with the provisions of this part [subpart 205]. The determination of when an Award is expended should be based on when the activity related to the award occurs.”

8. Project Close-Out

The project close-out shall be completed within 90 days of the end of the Award performance period or within 90 days of the completion of the project, whichever is earlier. Recipients must also draw down any remaining funds for expenditures incurred under this Award during this 90-day period.

The Project Close-out report shall be submitted on-line through the Denali Commission's on-line Project Database System, available at www.denali.gov. The project close out will require the recipient to submit the following information:

- a. Final data for each item listed in paragraph 7(a) "Progress Reports"
- b. Final project expenditures itemized by the following categories: planning & design; materials & equipment; freight; labor; project administration/overhead and other expenses.
- c. Acknowledgement of support: For all construction projects (including equipment installation) that exceed \$50,000 in total project costs, the Award recipient shall display a sign that acknowledges the Government's support for the project(s) developed under this Award. The Commission will provide an appropriate sign. The Award recipient (AHFC) must request an indoor and/or an outdoor sign from the Commission office. Pickup or delivery of the sign can be arranged at that time.
- d. Acknowledgement of support: For all non-construction projects, the Award recipient shall include an acknowledgement of the Government's support for the project(s) developed under this Award. The format for acknowledgement of the Government's support for non-construction awards will vary with each award and must be agreed upon between the Award recipient and the Denali Commission Program Manager. Costs associated with this requirement shall be paid out of the project funding received by the Award recipient from the Denali Commission.

9. Public Policy Laws and Assurances

Award Recipients are required to comply with the public policy laws and assurances on Standard Forms SF 424b (non-construction projects) or SF 424d (construction projects). This form must also be signed by a certifying official of the organization. Some of the laws are highlighted below for your reference.

To the maximum extent practicable, considering applicable laws, Funding Recipients shall accomplish the project contemplated by the Award using local Alaska firms and labor.

No portion of this award may be used for lobbying or propaganda purposes as prohibited by 18 U.S.C. Section 1913 or Section 607(a) of Public Law 96-74.

Project level environmental reviews in accordance with the National Environmental Policy Act (NEPA) and the National Historic Preservation Act (NHPA) are required for each project undertaken with Denali Commission funds.

10. Non-Compliance with Award Conditions

Recipients not in compliance with the terms and conditions of this Financial Assistance Award will be notified by the Denali Commission. The Denali Commission will work with the recipient to identify the steps necessary to bring them back into compliance, and will establish an appropriate time frame for the corrections to be made. If the corrections have not been made by the deadline, the Denali Commission reserves the right to either suspend or unilaterally terminate the Financial Assistance Award for non-performance.
