

1. Scope of Work

The Denali Commission (Commission) is providing a total of \$30,000 to the Alaska Energy Authority (AEA) for travel grants to provide the opportunity for people from Rural Alaska communities to attend the 2007 Rural Energy Conference. The Conference will be held April 24 - 26, 2007 in Fairbanks, Alaska.

See the attached request letter from Alaska Energy Authority, dated November 30, 2006 for funding details.

All Commission funding is intended for use for the scope of work identified in the Award document only. Any balance of funds remaining after the full scope of work has been completed will be returned to the Denali Commission.

2. Milestones

The following milestones are identified as the major steps to be completed as part of the project. "Planned" dates for the first milestone are included here. As part of each progress report, recipients shall update the progress toward meeting these milestones (see section 7, Reporting).

3. Award Performance Period

The Award performance period is February 1, 2007 through June 30, 2007. This is the period during which Award recipients can incur obligations or costs against this Award.

4. Direct and Indirect Costs

Payments shall be made in accordance with OMB Circular A-102. **No interest will be accrued on these funds.**

7. Reporting

Three forms of project reporting are required under this Award, listed below. AEA shall submit reports using the Denali Commission's on-line Project Database System, available at www.denali.gov. If there are technical limitations which may prevent the recipient from meeting this requirement, please contact the Program Manager listed in this agreement.

- a. **Progress Reports** shall be submitted on a quarterly basis. The first reporting period is February 1, 2007 through March 31, 2007, and every quarter thereafter. Reports are due within 30 days of the end of the reporting period. Progress reports shall include the following:
 - i. Total project funding, including both Denali Commission funding and other project funding sources.
 - ii. The total project expenditures for the project as of the end of the reporting period, including both Denali Commission and Other funding sources.
 - iii. Updated schedule and milestone information as identified in the Scope of Work
 - iv. Narrative summary of the conference, attendance and activities.
 - v. At least three photos representative of conference activities.

- b. **Standard Form 269A Financial Status Report – Short Form (SF269A)** shall be submitted on a quarterly basis via fax, e-mail or mail. As with the Progress Reports, the SF269A is due within 30 days of the end of the quarter and a final SF269A is due within 90 days of the end of the Award Performance Period. Please note the following:
 - i. This report cannot yet be submitted through the Denali Commission On-line Project Database and therefore must be submitted via fax, e-mail or mail.

A Guide to Completing the SF269A can also be found on the Denali Commission's website under the "Finance" section.

- iii. The SF269A may be filled out electronically using the above link. However, the completed SF269A must be printed and signed, and then the completed SF269A must be submitted to the Denali Commission via mail, fax or as a PDF attachment to an e-mail to finance@denali.gov.
 - iv. If you have multiple projects under a single Financial Assistance Award, the SF269A is required ONLY for the award as a whole, not for the individual projects.
- c. **Federal Single Audits** shall be submitted annually, when required. - c. Acknowledgement of support: The Award recipient shall include an acknowledgement of the Government’s support for the project(s) developed under this Award. The format for acknowledgement of the Government’s support for non-construction awards will vary with each award and must be agreed upon between the Award recipient and the Denali Commission Project Manager. Costs associated with this requirement shall be paid out of the project funding received by the Award recipient from the Denali Commission.
- d. Booth for the Denali Commission if applicable/requested by the Denali Commission.

9. Public Policy Laws and Assurances

Award Recipients are required to comply with the public policy laws and assurances on Standard Forms SF 424b (non-construction projects). This form must also be signed by a

If the corrections have not been made by the deadline, the Denali Commission reserves the right to either suspend or unilaterally terminate the Financial Assistance Award for non-performance.

Dear Ms. Guenther Lind,

This is a request for sponsorship for the Rural Energy Conference to be held in Fairbanks, Alaska, April 24-26, 2007. Funding from the Denali Commission is being sought to provide opportunity for people from rural communities to attend the Rural Energy Conference. Estimates for this conference put the number of attendees at 300.

This will be the fourth Rural Energy Conference. The first two conferences enjoyed a Denali Commission sponsorship for rural attendees. In 2005, Alaska Energy Authority (AEA) was unable to obtain a sponsorship from Denali Commission. The demand for rural attendees remains high, so AEA sought assistance from the USDA-RD and used state energy program funds to assist 41 travelers. 76 registrants signed up for assistance, several obtained assistance from other sources and a few had to cancel their travel plans.

To continue the high number of rural communities represented, all communities that have received or are set to receive a Denali sponsored RPSU or Bulk Fuel project will be encouraged to attend. Rural utility cooperatives such as AVEC, AP&T, and MKEC will all be encouraged to send one person from each community. And finally, special discounts have been arranged on Alaska Airlines, allowing funding that we receive to go further around the state.

Travel grants are provided to attendees for transportation only. Each community provides a "match" by paying for lodging and meals. We have secured low lodging rates and reduced the need for vehicular transportation. Most meals are provided at the conference, making this extremely affordable.

AEA requests sponsorship from a number of Alaskan companies and has a goal of \$100,000 of sponsorship this year. Sponsors are recognized through out the conference in accordance with the amount of gift. Special banners, announcements and acknowledgement are always involved.

AEA is asking for \$30,000 in Denali Commission funds for rural conference attendees. Rural attendees are the most important attendees of this conference and recruitment will be extremely active this year. We believe this conference is a valuable service to keeping the cost of power down in rural Alaska.
