***1. Scope of Work***

The scope of work that will be completed in part with Denali Commission funding includes:

- Planning and Design of the Yuut Elitnaurviat (Yuut) Phase 1 Campus;
- Construction of a 33,020 square foot facility referred to as the Technical Education and Support Services (TESS) building on the campus of Yuut Elitnaurviat- People's Learning Center. The TESS facility is a three story facility. Dormitory capacity will be 86 individuals, the projected educational capacity is 140 individuals.; (occupancy for fire code is higher than these capacity numbers); and
- Site work for the campus of Yuut Elitnaurviat Phase 1. This includes the completion of all roads required to provide access to the TESS facility and all utilities required to operate the TESS facility.

Denali Commission funds will be combined with other funds to complete this scope of work. The budget below reflects the scope of work below.

Denali Commission Funds will be used specifically for the construction of the TESS facility.

Yuut Elitnaurviat has demonstrated long term sustainability of the facility through a complete assessment of the expenditures required for the long term operations and maintenance of the facility and the available funding from partner organizations. A complete copy of this assessment is attached.

Denali Commission funding for this project is contingent on Yuut acquiring all funding for the construction of the facility before Denali Commission funding will be released. As stated in Denali Commission Resolution 04-12 YE has 18 months from signature of this award to acquire all funding for the construction of the project. If funding has not

been secured within 18 months, the Commission reserves the right to terminate this Award.

All Commission funding is intended for use for the scope of work identified in the Award document only. In the event there is a balance of funding remaining after the full scope of work has been completed, the Denali Commission shall determine how the excess funds will be allocated.

## **3. Award Performance Period**

- a. **Progress Reports** shall be submitted on a semi-annual basis through the Denali Commission's on-line Project Database. The first reporting period is 2/1/2004 through 6/30/2004, and each 6 months thereafter. Reports are due within 30 days of the end of the reporting period. Progress reports must follow the on-line reporting format and process which will collect the following information:
  - i. Total project funding, including both Denali Commission funding and other project funding sources.
  - ii. The total project expenditures for the project as of the end of the reporting period, including both Denali Commission and Other funding sources.
  - iii. Update to the schedule information as identified in the Scope of Work
  - iv. Narrative summary of the project status and accomplishments to date, and address the following questions: is the project on schedule, is the project on budget, and what actions are planned to address any project problems.
  - v. Photographic documentation of project progress shall be provided with the progress reports. The photo documentation shall include a minimum of three, dated photos per reporting period such that a complete record of the project is maintained over time, from "before," showing the situation before the start of the project, to "during" showing work proceeding on the project, and "after" to show the finished project. Photos shall be provided in a digital format as part of the on-line report. A short description of the activity and names of those in the photos shall also be provided.
- b. **Wage and Residency Reports** shall be submitted on an annual basis using the Denali Commission On-line Project Database. The reporting period is January 1<sup>st</sup> – December 31<sup>st</sup> of each year. Reports are due within 30 days of the end of the reporting period. The Wage and Residency Report shall include the following information by for each construction project
  - i. Total number of Local Residents employed during the year, and their total payroll earnings.
  - ii. Total number of Non-Local Alaska Residents employed during the year, and their total payroll earnings.

- iii. Total number of Non-Alaska Residents employed during the year, and their total payroll earnings.
  
- c. **Federal Single Audits** shall be submitted annually. In accordance with OMB Circular A-133, which requires [subpart 200] "Non-Federal entities that expend \$500,000 or more in a year in Federal awards shall have a single or program-specific audit conducted for that year in accordance with the provisions of this part. [subpart 205] The determination of when an award is expended should be based on when the activity related to the award occurs."

## **8. Project Close-Out**

- c. Acknowledgement of support: For all construction projects, Yuut shall include an acknowledgement of the Government's support for the project(s) developed under this Award. The Award recipient shall display a sign that:
  - i. Has the Denali Commission logo displayed on the upper right-hand quadrant;
  - ii. States the following: "This project was financed by the Denali Commission and its partners (*list the name of the funding partners*)";
  - iii. Shows the logo of each partner in the lower right-hand quadrant.

The cost of this sign shall be paid out of the project funding received by the Award recipient from the Denali Commission. Final approval of signage material and placement of sign must be obtained from the Commission Project Manager.
