

A. INTRODUCTION

Throughout this Amendment these entities are referred to as follows:

Kodiak Island Health Care Foundation	=	KIHCF
Alaska Native Tribal Health Consortium	=	ANTHC
Cooperative Project Agreement	=	CPA
Denali Commission	=	Commission

On April 20, 2004, ANTHC and the Kodiak Island Health Care Foundation executed a CPA authorized by the Denali Commission to perform the design and the construction planning to renovate existing space within the Providence Kodiak Island Medical Center into a Kodiak Community Health Center. The medical center is owned by the Kodiak Island Borough, and the community health center is owned by the Kodiak Island Health Care Foundation. No construction was performed under this project phase.

B. REVISION OF PROJECT FUNDING

The project was funded with \$128,500, via Denali Commission Financial Assistance Award 0071-DC-2002-I24, Addendum A, dated December 2003; however, the performance period of that award expired Dec. 31, 2006. At that time, \$78,559.82 of those funds had been expensed.

To financially close Award 0071-DC-2002-I24, the Commission de-obligated the project balance of \$49,940.18, and replaced it with funding from Denali Commission Financial Assistance Award No. 0100-DC-2003-I13, Amendment No. 3, dated February 2007.

In September 2007, Denali Commission awarded additional funding of \$318,553.00 via award 288-07, Amendment No. 2. Later that same month, the Commission de-obligated \$233,606.22 via award 288-07 Addendum A and re-obligated the \$233,606.22 to the project via award 0100-DC-2003-I13 Addendum J.
