

A. INTRODUCTION

Financial Assistance Sub-Award	=	FSA

On October 28, 2002, the ANTHC and the Native Village of Venetie Tribal Government executed a Financial Assistance Sub-Award (FSA) to perform the design studies and construction planning for a new health clinic in Venetie, Alaska. No construction was performed under this project phase.

This project was originally funded with \$86,000, via Denali Commission Financial Assistance Award Project No. 0071-DC-2002-I24, Amendment No. 1, dated September 2002.

The project has previously been amended as follows:

Amendment No. 1 to the FSA deobligated the project balance of \$30,658 and reflected the program management fees of \$43,300 which were not listed in the original FSA, bringing the amended project balance to \$98,642.

Federal funding for this project requires an environmental review in accordance with the National Environmental Policy Act (NEPA) and the National Historic Preservation Act (NHPA). The Alaska Native Tribal Health Consortium (ANTHC) uses the Indian Health Service (IHS) environmental review procedures as outlined in the Environmental Review Manual, issued in January 2007. Current IHS policy (Federal Register, Vol. 58, No. 3, January 6, 1993, pp. 569-572) allows for categorical exclusion of actions and construction activity that do not have a significant impact on the environment.

The original scope of work for Project AN 02-G57 was to provide design and construction planning for a new health clinic in Venetie, Alaska.

An environmental review completed in October 2002 recommended a determination of eligibility for categorical exclusion from the IHS for Project No. AN 02-G57. This amendment adds additional funding for cost estimate updates, and the environmental impacts reviewed are within the scope of the original document and consistent with current regulations. No additional environmental review is necessary at this time.

The ANTHC will revisit this environmental review to determine if potential environmental concerns have been addressed if the scope of work changes.
