This award will be used to develop and/or institute various rural construction training programs to strengthen and build the rural construction workforce. These construction training programs will be made available to rural Alaskan residents and will support the construction of Denali Commission projects. Alaska Works Partnership will collaborate with local, regional, and statewide construction training initiatives to build alliances, share resources, and leverage Denali Commission Funding to the best extent possible.

Grant Activity	Description of Activity
Training Administrative Support for Rural and BMR	Initial administrative support went into planning and preparing four training events for Wx Tech I: Introduction to Weatherization. Two training events were held in Anchorage, and two training event were held in Fairbanks. Costs related to implementing the training events were covered by ANTHC. During four training events, 50 participants received weatherization training.
Rural Training	Seventeen participants were trained in carpentry and weatherization during the New Builders training. Participants were trained in basic carpentry and weatherization. Twenty-one participants received "Lead Safe" training at King Salmon.
BMR Training	Boiler maintenance and repair training was held in Dillingham for 11 BMR participants.
Rural Apprenticeship Outreach (AO)	Staff hosted booths or gave presentations at Anchorage, Ketchikan, Juneau, Sitka, Nome and Fairbanks Career Fair Events. Information on careers in construction and assistance available to rural applicants was provided at the Career Fairs.
AO Cont.	New flyers were developed for the Southern and Southeastern Plumbers & Pipefitters, Cement Masons/Plasterers, Southern Painters, Ironworkers, and Electrical Workers JATCs for distribution to community centers and Job Centers statewide via fax and email, and for posting on our website. In addition, the AWP website was updated to add the new program openings.
AO Cont.	Letters were mailed out to contacts, which provided apprenticeship information and application dates/deadlines for Southern and Southeastern Plumbers & Pipefitters, Piledrivers, Cement Masons/Plasterers, Southern Painters, Ironworkers, and Electrical Workers.

AO Cont.	Additional Support Services such as travel, lodging, cold weather gear and tools were provided to eight (8) new apprentices and one (1) apprentice applicant. Apprentices are from Nulato, Ketchikan, Beaver, Klawock, Barrow, Seward, Copper Center and Stebbins. The apprentice applicant is from Ekwok.

AO	AO does not provide skills training, but rather, provides assistance to clients applying and interviewing for apprenticeship programs, which includes; interview skills training; referrals to driver's education and adult basic education courses; and job training that leads to work experience that increases their chances of getting into apprenticeship programs such as Pipeline Training, Welders Helper training, and Construction Academies.

AO	The grant started October 2008 and will run through June 2010. Apprenticeship Outreach has provided one or more services for Two hundred twenty-one (221) clients. Of those served, Forty-seven (47) have been registered with the USDOL as trade apprentices where they receive training from their apprenticeship sponsors and are employed in on-the-job training.
