Pursuant to the terms and conditions of the Grant/Award, this Authorization:

The Denali Commission (Commission) is providing up to \$1,132,476 to the Alaska Native Tribal Health Consortium (ANTHC) for a pass-through arrangement with Norton Sound Health Corporation (NSHC) for the purpose of completing the design, preparation, and pre-construction work associated with the new Nome Hospital campus.

This entire scope will be accomplished through the completion of three separate projects. Each project will be facilitated with individual Project Authorizations and project numbers. This will enable clear progress reporting for each.

The three projects funded under the general scope of Nome Hospital Campus are:

- 1314-D AN11-GN3 Long Term Care Planning
- 1314-E AN11-GN4 Transition Planning
- 1314-C AN11-GN5 Training

This Project Authorization specifically covers the following project:

- The planning, design, site work and pre-construction activities of a replacement Long Term Care center to be attached to the new Hospital.

Funding for the scope of this project is up to a total of \$1,024,309 via two grant vehicles:

- \$260,497 on Denali Commission award 1002 (PA 1002-A)
- \$763,812 via this award and Project Authorization

The project includes an 18-20 bed Long Term Care wing co-located to the hospital now under construction. Norton Sound Health Corporation (NSHC) operates an existing 15-bed Long Term Care facility, Quyanna Care Center (QCC), within the existing hospital, which has been determined to be beyond its useful life and in need of replacement. The QCC is not included in the plans for the new Nome Hospital, which is two miles from the old hospital and QCC locations. Incorporating the new QCC at the new hospital campus site will help ensure the viability of the facility and of NSHC, as the QCC is the primary revenue producing service of NSHC. Its co-location with the hospital is critical for the sustainability of both.

The following milestones are identified as the major steps to be completed as part of this project. "Planned" dates for the first milestone are included here. As part of each progress report, recipients shall update the progress toward meeting these milestones

Design: July 1, 2010 through June 30, 2012

Project Close-Out: July 1, 2012 through September 30, 2012
