Pursuant to the terms and conditions of the Grant/Award, this Authorization:

The Denali Commission (Commission) is providing up to \$1,132,476 to the Alaska Native Tribal Health Consortium (ANTHC) for a pass-through arrangement with Norton Sound Health Corporation (NSHC) for the purpose of completing the design, preparation, and pre-construction work associated with the new Nome Hospital.

This entire scope will be accomplished through the completion of three separate projects. Each project will be facilitated with individual Project Authorizations and project numbers. This will enable clear progress reporting for each.

The three projects funded under the general scope of Nome Hospital Campus are:

- 1314-D AN11-GN3 Long Term Care Planning
- 1314-E AN11-GN4 Transition Planning
- 1314-C AN11-GN5 Training

This Project Authorization specifically covers the following aspects of training associated with the Nome Hospital project that will be tracked, monitored and completed through 1 FTE Preceptor/Transition Planner by January 31, 2013:

- NSHC will hire one (1) FTE Preceptor/Transition Planner and will be responsible for coordinating, tracking and monitoring the NSHC training plan for the new Nome Hospital.
- NSHC will seek out, retain and mentor three (3) Certified Medical Assistants (CMA) who will graduate to primary care through the process of a six (6) month on-site internship. These internships will begin on January 1, 2012 and three full-time CMA jobs will commence on July 1, 2012.
- NSHC will train 4 current NSHC registered nurses in emergency medicine to work in the newly constructed emergency room (ER) unit. Training will begin on January 1, 2012 and full-time employment in the ER will begin on July 1, 2012.
- NSHC will create and recruit for the position of 1 FTE ER/Urgent Care Nurse Director. Employment for this position will begin on July 1, 2012.
- NSHC will support four (4) residents to complete the 2-year registered nurses program provided by the Nome Campus and offer full-time employment by January 1, 2013.
- NSHC will create three (3) internships for the position of Health Unit Coordinators. The internships will begin on January 1, 2012 and full-time employment will be offered on July 1, 2012.

This Project Authorization permits up to \$161,832 is provided for this project scope.

- 4 FTE - (retain positions) Emergency Medical Nurses trained by July 1, 2012
- 1 FTE - (new position) Urgent Care Nurse Director hired by July 1, 2012
- 4 FTE - (new positions) Registered Nurses trained and employed by January 1, 2013
- 3 FTE - (new positions) Health Unit Coordinators trained and employed by July 1, 2012
