On July 5, 2011, the ANTHC and the Southeast Alaska Regional Health Consortium executed a Cooperative Project Agreement (CPA) to complete the Pelican Health Clinic Code and Condition Survey. No construction was performed under this project phase.

This project was originally funded with \$36,000, via Denali Commission Financial Assistance Award 220-06 Amendment 7, dated April 2011.

TO: NEPA Determination

Federal funding for this project requires an environmental review in accordance with the National Environmental Policy Act (NEPA) and the National Historic Preservation Act (NHPA). The Alaska Native Tribal Health Consortium (ANTHC) uses the Indian Health Service (IHS) environmental review procedures as outlined in the Environmental Review Manual, issued in January 2007. Current IHS policy (Federal Register, Vol. 58, No. 3, January 6, 1993, pp. 569-572) allows for categorical exclusion of actions and construction activity that do not have a significant impact on the environment.

The original scope of work for Project AN 11-GM8 was to conduct a Code and Condition Survey for the Pelican health clinic.

ANTHC completed an environmental consideration for Project No. AN 11-GM8 in May 2011. This project does not include any ground disturbing activities, and therefore does not have any environmental impacts. This amendment changes the amounts in the funding and cost tables. The environmental impacts reviewed are within the scope of the original document and consistent with current regulations. No additional environmental review is necessary.
