



A. INTRODUCTION

Throughout this Amendment these entities are referred to as follows:

Village of Tanacross	=	Village
Alaska Native Tribal Health Consortium	=	ANTHC
Financial Assistance Sub-Award	=	FSA
Denali Commission	=	Commission

On June 12, 2003, ANTHC and the Village of Tanacross executed an FSA authorized by the Denali Commission to perform the design, construction planning and construction for a new health clinic in the Village of Tanacross, Alaska.

The project was funded with \$755,216.72 of Commission funds, via Denali Commission Financial Assistance Award Project No. 0071-DC-2002-I24, Amendment No. 1, dated September 2002. Because this was a design and construction project, the Village also provided a cost share of \$210,000.

B. REVISION OF PROJECT FUNDING

The project has had \$751,416.72 of Commission funds de-obligated, via Denali Commission Financial Assistance Award Project No. 0071-DC-2002-I24, Addendum K, dated January 2007. The balance of Commission funds, \$3,800, was expensed to a firm that performed an independent review of the project's construction cost estimate.

The project never progressed to construction; consequently, the Village's cost share was never received by ANTHC nor entered into its accounting system.

This Administrative Amendment hereby updates the record to identify these changes to project funding. Since funds were either de-obligated or expensed, none remain. The project has therefore been terminated.
