On July 2, 2011, the ANTHC and the Yakutat Tlingit Tribe executed a Cooperative Project Agreement (CPA) to complete the Yakutat Clinic Code and Condition Survey. No construction was performed under this project phase.

Federal funding for this project requires an environmental review in accordance with the National Environmental Policy Act (NEPA) and the National Historic Preservation Act (NHPA). The Alaska Native Tribal Health Consortium (ANTHC) uses the Indian Health Service (IHS) environmental review procedures as outlined in the Environmental Review Manual, issued in January 2007. Current IHS policy (Federal Register, Vol. 58, No. 3, January 6, 1993, pp. 569-572) allows for categorical exclusion of actions and construction activity that do not have a significant impact on the environment.

The original scope of work for Project AN 11-GM9 was to complete the Yakutat Health Clinic Code and Condition Survey.

ANTHC completed an environmental review for Project No. AN 11-GM9 in May 2011. This project does not include any ground disturbing activities, and therefore does not have any environmental impacts. This amendment changes the amounts in the funding and cost tables. The environmental impacts reviewed are within the scope of the original document and consistent with current regulations. No additional environmental review is necessary.
