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## **RESOLUTION NO. 05-16**

### **A RESOLUTION CONCERNING PRIMARY HEALTH CARE PROJECTS FOR FEDERAL FY 2005**

**WHEREAS** the Denali Commission Act of 1998 was amended in 1999 to allow the Commission to plan, construct and equip health facility infrastructure for Alaska; and

**WHEREAS** the Congressional intent language in the Federal Fiscal Year 2005 (FFY05) Omnibus Appropriations directs \$40 MM (million) to the Denali Commission as a direct lump sum payment pursuant to Public Law 106-113 for health facility projects and programs, of which \$9,762,000 has been obligated via Resolution 05-02 in January 2005 to primary health care projects; and

**WHEREAS** \$4,488,312 of the FY05 funding remains available for primary health care facility projects; and

**WHEREAS** \$315,055 of FY04 Domestic Violence funding has been determined to be excess to the identified needs of that program; and

**WHEREAS** \$2,044,263 of FY05 Elder Supportive Housing funding has been determined to be excess to the identified needs of that program; and

**WHEREAS** \$5,190,275 of the FY05 Bethel Psychiatric Treatment Facility funding has been determined to be excess to the needs of that facility and of the associated program and, in consultation with Congressional staff has been reallocated for primary care facilities; and

**WHEREAS** all FY05 Health Facilities funds are required by the Health Resources and Services Administration (HRSA) to be expended by September 2007;

**NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED** the Denali Commission allocates the remaining primary health care facility funds and the funds determined to be in excess of other programs totaling \$12,037,905 to the following primary health care projects subject to each project meeting all Denali Commission requirements:

- Clark's Point      \$ 224,000    clinic construction
- Twin Hills        \$ 600,000    clinic construction
- Port Lions        \$ 500,000    clinic construction
- Old Harbor        \$ 375,000    clinic construction
- Klukwan           \$ 50,000     clinic construction

- Aleknagik            \$1,047,000    clinic construction
- Nome                \$1,680,000    Indian Health Service hospital replacement design
- Barrow              \$1,970,000    Indian Health Service hospital replacement design
- Bethel               \$4,000,000    Primary Health Care Center planning, design and pre-construction
  
- Glenallen            \$ 400,000     clinic repair and renovation
- Whittier             \$ 150,000     clinic repair and renovation
- Statewide           \$1,041,905    Alaska Native Tribal Health Consortium clinic design pool and other construction (design pool currently includes 18 communities awaiting clinic design funds); and be it


**FURTHER RESOLVED** that any funds allocated by this resolution are to be reallocated to other projects on the primary care facility priority list if listed projects failed to proceed in a time frame that will allow full utilization of the funds within the time frame established by HRSA; and be it

**FURTHER RESOLVED** that any additional excess FY04 Domestic Violence funds are to be allocated for primary projects on the priority list.


**CERTIFICATION**
