Dear Friends of the Denali Commission,

Break-up Brings Flooding to Villages

While many in Alaska have been enjoying an unusually warm spring, the resulting annual "break-up" of ice has caused Alaska's worst flooding in decades. Many villages along the Yukon, Kuskowkim and



Koyukuk Rivers have been affected. Governor Palin has issued a disaster declaration for many of these communities.

While communities assess the damage and begin the process of rebuilding, the Denali Commission, with our partners will continue to focus on solutions that have lasting results. Our major energy program partners, the Alaska Village Electrical Cooperative (AVEC) and the Alaska Energy Authority (AEA) report that, except for some temporary service disruptions, all of the Denali Commission funded bulk fuel and power plant systems are unharmed at this time. We will keep you updated on the progress of these communities.

MOU Federal and State Partners Meeting

The Denali Commission and the State of Alaska hosted a coordination meeting of federal and state agency leaders on May 18th. We covered urgent issues regarding the upcoming 2010 census, the latest demographic trends, recommendations from the State's Immediate Action Workgroup, updates from the Alaska Clearinghouse (see below), updates on the State Energy Plan and Railbelt utility issues.

The Energy Efficiency and Conservation Block Grant program provides a glimpse into the important coordination work. While this funding is aimed at federally recognized tribes, Native corporations, states and municipalities many recipients are unaware they must apply for the money. And once received, they must follow strict reporting associated with funds received. The Clearinghouse team is providing community outreach and answering questions on this grant process and other projects as they arise. The Clearinghouse continues to use a list serve, Twitter account, and our website, as well as speaking events and office visits to address these issues. In Focus: Update on the Denali Commission Training Program

An Update on the Denali Commission's Training Program by <u>Karen Johnson</u>, <u>Program Manager</u>.

In 1998, the Denali Commission Act was passed by Congress creating an innovative approach to address the infrastructure and economic



challenges in rural Alaska. The creation of the Denali Training fund at the Denali Commission (Commission) soon followed creating a training program with a mission to build a strong rural workforce capable to construct new facilities in their community and maintain and operate it successfully. This unparalleled training initiative has created hundreds of jobs for rural Alaskans.

The Commission's Training Program strives to improve and include local residents in the building and betterment of their communities through job training. The history of the training program confirms that training has been and continues to be delivered to rural areas through established training entities and dedicated partners who are able to carry out the mission and the priorities of the Commission.

- The Commission partners with the State of Alaska Department of Labor (DOL) to reduce redundancy, leverage dollars and ensure that all rural Alaska residents have the same training opportunities.
- To measure the success of the Denali Training Fund (DTF), each participant completes an application that is entered in the state's data system which tracks his or her employability over time. A recent State of Alaska Department of Labor Research & Analysis retroactive report (2000-2007) on the Commission's training program shows the following outcomes: the Denali Training Fund has increased wages of its participants by a staggering 64.4% and shows a 12.1% increase in employment.
- The DTF has had 4,480 participants complete training programs between 2000-2007.
- Over 1,000 individuals have been trained through the allied health initiative and are working across the state in this high growth, high demand area.
- Over 4,000 individuals from rural communities have been trained in construction trades that have directly led to employment in their communities and/or region.
- The DTF has integrated the construction trades apprenticeship model into many of its training initiatives and has enrolled over 355 apprentices in various constructions trades. The DTF rural construction recruitment strategy includes an excellent ratio of woman 21% and minorities 65% (Alaska Natives) entering the construction apprenticeship program.
- Over 1,000 youth access supplementary training programs through the Denali Youth Initiative who gain valuable work experience, career awareness and employability skills that have helped them prosper in Alaska's growing workforce.
