## A Message from Federal Co-Chair, *Joel Neimeyer*

### **Dear Friends of the Denali Commission,**

It has been some time since our last eNewsletter so we have much to share with you this month. Fall is soon upon us and with it comes a new wave of activity at the Denali Commission (Commission).

In 2005, Congress passed H.R. 3 – the Safe, Accountable Flexible Efficient Transportation Equity Act: A Legacy for Users (SAFETEA-LU). This Act has provided the Commission with annual funding for its transportation program, which includes both roads and waterfront projects.



Funding is expected to continue into 2012, or until such time as the Highway Reauthorization occurs. The Commission's transportation program provides an opportunity to address some of the unique challenges faced by our rural residents. Funds for this program can be used for: roads, streets, board roads, roads between rural communities, roads to access resource development, dust control, access to boat launch sites for commercial and subsistence fisheries, access to barge landings, storm evacuation roads and ATV hardened trails. The FY11 Transportation Nomination Process is now open. The deadline for project nominations is November 3, 2010. See our website for the Transportation Program FY11 Roads and Waterfront Project Nomination Form and the instructions for nominations.

The Commission has recently completed an interim report titled: Sustainable Rural Communities. This important report was requested by the Alaska Delegation and focuses on the barriers to sustainable rural communities in Alaska. The collective goal for the federal agencies that participated in this project, was to identify barriers that federal agencies can address. We are now asking for additional comment on this report from our non-federal partners. Please comment by September 17, 2010 both on the barriers already discussed, and on any barriers we may have missed. We need feedback on the interim report and have an end goal of either adding an addendum to this existing report or rewriting the report with the newly added suggestions incorporated. We look forward to your valuable input in this important project. With your help we can, as partners, look at the barriers to creating Sustainable Rural Communities. Specific questions on this project can be directed to Sharon Lind on my staff.

The <u>Denali Commission FY10 Work Plan</u> was signed by the Secretary of Commerce in July 2010. The Denali Commission determines its own basic operating principles and funding criteria on an annual federal fiscal year (October 1 to September 30) basis. The Commission outlines these priorities and funding recommendations in our annual Work Plan, which is adopted annually. Approval of this plan allows the Commission to enter into grant agreements and obligate federal funds. The Commission is hard at work issuing the grant agreements outlined in the FY10 Work Plan. We look forward to collaborating with our numerous partners on

# USDA HIGH ENERGY COST GRANT PROGRAM

Agriculture Under Secretary Dallas Tonsager today announced that USDA is accepting applications for the High Energy Cost Grant program.

Grants ranging from \$75,000 to \$5 million will be awarded to businesses, non-profit entities, states, local governments, and federally recognized Indian tribes. These grants will be used for on-grid and off-grid renewable energy projects serving eligible communities. USDA will award approximately 20 grants with the \$15.5 million provided through this notice of funding availability.
